Stan represented Australia in the development of ISO 45001 as a member of ISO PC283 since its formation. He has represented Australia at ISO meetings or acted as a liaison member in the development and revision of a number of ISO standards including 14001/4 Environmental Management System (EMS), 19011 auditing management systems, 37101 sustainable communities, 14016 assurance of environmental reports and other related standards. He is a member of Standards Australia Committee SF1 on Occupational Health and Safety and EVO21 on Environmental Management.

Haslayati Hashim

Haslayati Hashim has contributed to the standard through membership of ISCW (Malaysian National Standards Development Committee on OH&S) and was a member of TC/W/6 the Malaysian mirror committee for PC283. She currently represents Malaysia on ISO TC 283 (ISO Technical Committee on OH&S Management) and participated in the TC's inaugural meeting in the UK in September 2018 and is actively participating in TC 283 Working Group 3 (WG3) as a task group leader on developing the ISO 45001- Implementation Handbook. She was also a technical expert on ISO/CASCO/JWG 48 that developed ISO/IEC TS 17021-10 the standard on competence requirements for certification auditors of OH&S management systems which has now been published. Currently Haslayati is also involved in developing the Malaysian Standard on emergency preparedness and response (EPR) - "Guidelines in managing emergencies in facilities" and translating ISO 45001:2018 into Bahasa Malaysia on behalf of ISCW. She had actively participated in the National Stakeholders Consultation for ISO/DIS 45001 organised by DSM/SIRIM in April 2016 and facilitated MSOSH's Public Comment Process for the Draft MS ISO 45001:2018.

Amarjit Kaur

Amarjit is a member of ISO TC207 SC1 (Technical Committee for the development and revision of Environmental Management System Standards) representing the Malaysian National Mirror Committee ISZ /TC1 and was an expert on the Working Groups developing ISO 14001:2015, ISO 14004:2016 and 17021-2. Amarjit has also participated in the development of other ISO standards including 14005, 19011, 14069 and 14016 on phased implementation of an EMS, auditing, carbon footprints and assurance of environmental reports, respectively. Since the publication of ISO 14001:2015 she has provided training and seminars nationally and internationally for organizations such as the Swedish Standards Institute, Department of Standards Malaysia, SIRIM, APEC-Pacific Accreditation Cooperation, the Indian and Indonesian accreditation bodies, NABCB and KAN respectively.
